



tephen Kuusisto is a poet and author who happens to be blind. He describes in his book, "Have Dog, Will Travel," the day he gets his first guide dog in his late 30's. Most of the book is about his relationship with the spirited Labrador and the freedom of movement the dog brings to his life. The book also looks back at the difficulties of his youth in the late 1950's and early 60's. His parents, who both suffered with alcoholism, were ashamed of his blindness and encouraged him to hide it.

Kuusisto recalls walking into a random church at 17 years old. His young soul was tied in a knot of shame, loneliness, and fear. Stephen was battling depression and his body was wasting away because of an eating disorder. When Communion is served — a sacrament that he knew nothing about — he knelt to partake the bread and the wine among strangers. As he does, he feels "his own flesh and blood kissed from somewhere deep and still."

This is a mystifying and transforming moment for Kuusisto and it renews a resolve to live. However, he notes that he never mentioned the experience to anyone. In the book, he shares an experience he had for decades kept to himself. He does not explain why he kept silent all these years, except to say he leaves room for mystery.

There is an empathetic power in sharing our occasions of joy, sorrow, and everything in between. I often ask new members to share their faith journey with the Session. The faith story often includes mystical moments that they have interpreted as God drawing closer to them in a sort of communion. By sharing these experiences with other believers, it draws us all together, renewing and affirming our identity as children of God.


My favorite part of the Christmas story in Luke is 2:19. After the shepherds come to worship her son, Mary "treasurered all these things and pondered them in her heart." A dozen years later, when Mary and Joseph find the young Jesus talking to the teachers in the temple in Jerusalem, she again "treasurered all these things in her heart." We know Mary became a leader in the early church but we do not have any record of her sharing the significance of those hushed cherishing's. Maybe Luke did not feel it was his story to tell.

It takes great trust to share our interior lives with the exterior world. It is much easier, and far less threatening, to make Facebook posts about what you had for lunch and where you got great Christmas bargains. However, experiences intimately held between us and God have great power. Maybe some moments belong in our private space for a time.

I know the familiar birth narratives by heart. Yet, I often experience something mysteriously comforting when I sit in silence and hear them read in worship. I believe God is still shaping us with His grace. Listening without speaking — pondering — is part of God's transforming work.
