ast Sunday, Mark Pfarrer kicked off our Capital Fund Drive by recalling the first Sunday, nearly twenty years ago (it was October 2, 1994) when Rev. McDaniel led the congregation from the previous worship space, now our fellowship hall, into our new sanctuary. As the congregation walked in they were asked to take off their shoes and feel the carpet of the sacred space which would be their new home. That day was the culmination of many long years struggle to complete the campus plan. In the past twenty years the Lord has blessed this church. The architectural design has stood the test of time. As the landscaping around the church has matured, the view outside the windows is even more spectacular during each change of seasons. The Lord is good.

Mark went on to say we have reached the point in the life of the church family to have "The Talk." The Talk is the conversation that families must reluctantly have at various moments during their life together. The Talk is the frank discussion about the necessity to marshal the resources and make the decisions to secure the investment in the family home. This is a conversation many families put off. There are always some who think now is not the right time. Couldn't we wait a few more years? Mark is very experienced in the upkeep and care of the building. When the heat or air conditioning is not working, Mark is who I call at 7:30 AM Sunday morning. Mark and son Daniel replace light bulbs in the exit lights and high up on the ceiling.

He knows the facilities and he designs large governmental buildings.

After nearly 10 years of dedicated effort, and several hundred thousands of dollars, we have restored Dodds Hall and the CE Building. We still have some work to do in the church kitchen and the installation of new restrooms in the CE is about to start, but we know that now is the right time to tackle some major upgrades to our Sanctuary. You will be receiving a letter asking you to make a pledge toward our restoration of the Sanctuary. The main components of the work will be included in a brochure to be distributed to everyone. As Mark mentioned, the main components in the work include the following: re-shingle the Sanctuary roof, replace the malfunctioning heating and air conditioning system, install of new carpet and refurbish the pews and chairs. When you add resurfacing of the parking lot and work in the kitchen, we have almost \$250,000 work that needs immediate attention.

The Capital Campaign Committee is already out telling the story. Your Elder and Deacons will be given a complete presentation of the work on May 5 and they will be asked to make a commitment to the project ahead of the May 18th Pledge Sunday. I would ask you to prayerfully consider how you can support this important project.
