The Caller

We are entering the summer months and several things are happening at CCPC.

First, the Spring Capital Drive is continuing to move towards its goal. So far we have received checks/pledges of \$241,000. Of that amount, over \$105,000 has already been received. We are confident we will easily exceed the \$250,000 goal. We have enough money on hand to order the fabric for the pews and the Sanctuary carpet. We hope to arrange for the refurbishment of the pews and the installation of the carpet to take place in late July or early August. As additional funds become available, the Building and Grounds committee will award a bid for the replacement of the sanctuary heating and air conditioning unit. We will probably worship in Dodds Hall for at least one Sunday this summer. Thank you for your generosity.

Second, for several reasons we decided to not hold Vacation Bible School this summer. The majority of our children are either younger, or older, than the 4-11 age group that VBS targets. The program we run requires dozens of volunteers to present the Bible stories, feed the children and the staff an evening meal, provide outdoor games, and lead the worship and singing. To manage the children requires at least 15 older youth to escort them to each programming module. With several key volunteers not available this summer, and since we don't have a youth coordinator in place to recruit and train the youth crew leaders, we decided to suspend VBS for this year. To provide opportunities for fun and fellowship with families, we will have the popular "Toddler VBS" on Saturday morning, July 19th from 9:30-11:30 AM and a "Family Olympics" program in August.

Finally, our pastoral assistant, Margaret Hallau, announced her retirement. Margaret will remain on the job until August 1st in order to help facilitate the many summer events and vacations (I will be gone three weeks in June and July). The Session has decided to use this time to study the overall staffing needs of the church. We have come to believe we need a trained and experienced, full time leader to oversee the entire spiritual development of the congregation. With Margaret's retirement and the existing opening in the Youth Coordinator's position, we have a unique opportunity to study our needs and devise a comprehensive strategy going forward. The Session is forming a committee to develop a vision for our overall program and to devise a position description for a new leader. The committee hopes to have a plan in place by the July 21st Session meeting. At some point this summer you will be surveyed about how we can best address your spiritual growth. Please pray for the committee.

In the meantime, I appreciate the effort of Elders Kristen Zacheis and Debbie Armstrong to keep the youth program going. We have a good sized group of Junior High students going on the June 28-30th retreat. We have six high school youth going to the Montreat Youth Conference in late July (we could use another chaperone). I have enjoyed teaching the wonderful group of Confirmation students that will join the church on June 8th.

Good things are happening. Better things await us in the future. God is always good.
