



Vacation Bible School Needs You!

“God’s new beginnings require our participation” is something our Pastor James Brassard said in his sermon the first Sunday I was here at CCPC. This is a call to action!! Not only is it important for members to participate, but it is also important for members to invite others to participate. One of the hardest parts about being new is not knowing as many kids and families as I would like to yet; I need your help! Sign up to volunteer but also invite friends, neighbors, co-workers’ children or any other kids you know. This will not only help make Vacation Bible School (VBS) successful, but is an opportunity to make a difference and share the Gospel with children who might not hear it otherwise. VBS is not only a church event, but a community event, so let’s share it with the community. With this year’s theme “Hometown Nazareth,” VBS will be an opportunity for kids of all ages to learn about and experience what life might have been like for Jesus as a kid and most importantly they will learn that Jesus not only was born and died for all of our sins. The Love of Christ will be experienced through worship, play, song, dance, lessons, and fun!

What’s New This Year:

- ◆ There will be 4 nights:
 - This year VBS spans 4 nights, Monday- Thursday from 5:30 to 8:30 PM. Why? Two reasons, I have often found that volunteers are exhausted by the 5th day and could use the extra rest. Second, in the group curriculum, one day is usually less consistent with theme or just really hard to pull off, this allows more flexibility with what we do for lessons, crafts, etc.

- Marketplace would be like when Jesus was young. Each child will earn coins throughout their other group activities and they get to spend them in the Marketplace at different activity stations. At these stations, they will get to participate in hands on activities and crafts such as bead making, tie dying, and farming in addition to experiencing what some of the local produce would have been. There will also be a special marketplace activity on the last day.
- ◆ Not having VBS last year:
 - Last year there was no large group VBS. This year, we hope to make up for it with gusto. It has been 2 years since we have seen many of the kids that have participated in the past, so we need your help tracking everyone down and getting the word spread that CCPC is having VBS again this year.
- ◆ Justin:
 - This is my first year doing VBS here at CCPC, so I am sure there will be some growing pains; however, VBS is one of the best times of the church year and I am excited about what we have planned
- ◆ Pre-K
 - We now have special class sections that includes kids that previously had not been a part of the large group VBS. They will require some special attention for sure!

What's The Same This Year:

- ◆ Mission:
 - The goal to share the love and good news of Christ with all of the children who attend!
- ◆ Group VBS:
 - Kids will be assigned to various groups and will move to different stations with their group.
- ◆ Location:
 - CCPC! VBS will be held on the CCPC campus every night.
- ◆ Dinner:
 - Will be provided every night in Dodds Hall. This way no one can say that VBS interferes with dinnertime!
- ◆ Need for Volunteers and Supplies:

- **WE NEED YOUR HELP!** There will be a large board of supply donations needed available on Sunday. Please see the board to find what you can help supply. We also need you to sign up to volunteer to be there. Please sign up on the sign up sheets that will be available on Sunday.

An Opportunity To Serve

Christian Community Presbyterian Church (CCPC) falls under the National Capital Presbytery (NCP) which serves 108 churches in the national capital region for the Presbyterian Church (USA). The NCP supports our church in many ways. It conducts six meetings each year as one means to manage the business and spiritual needs of the member churches in the Presbytery. The makeup of the voting participants at these meetings is half clergy and half church elders. Our pastor regularly attends these meetings. In addition, CCPC is allocated a number of "Elder Commissioners" for these meetings each year. For the coming year, CCPC has been allocated two Elder Commissioners. The Session fills these positions from Elders in our membership. At the May meeting, the Session elected Elder Chuck Tanner to continue representing CCPC in this capacity, which he has done for many years. The Session is seeking another Elder to fill the second position. An Elder currently on session could probably provide the best link between church and presbytery, but any ordained Elder is eligible. And, the session can designate an Elder as a Commissioner for a single meeting or for many meetings.

Currently, the Presbytery meets at National Presbyterian Church in Northwest D.C., usually on the 3rd or 4th Tuesday of selected months. The current schedule calls for "open space" time beginning at 4:00 PM, when many interest groups have an opportunity to present issues and enlist participation in their projects and programs. At about 5:00 PM, time is allocated for a meal. You may bring your own or purchase in advance a box meal for about \$10. The meeting usually begins at 6:00 PM, and a worship service is always incorporated within the meeting. Reports are heard from presbytery committees and the Presbytery Council, and often votes are taken on their proposals. The meetings are usually over by 9:00 PM, sometimes earlier. The remaining meetings for 2015 are scheduled for September 22nd and November 17th. Chuck can offer a ride from CCPC leaving at 3:00 PM.

Participation in the Presbytery is an important part of our Presbyterian form of church government, and of our Presbyterian tradition. Every Elder should participate in a presbytery meeting at least once, either as a commissioner, or as just an observer.
