Last Sunday, we marked another milestone towards adulthood when we had a "Blessing of the Keys" ceremony for Tatiana and Nik Kobe. Although getting a driver's license is not as big an event as it used to be, it does provide the freedom to easily go places without relying on someone else, usually your parents, to drive you there. One of the happiest days for me was when my oldest son got his license and started sharing the duties of shuttling himself and his three younger siblings to their numerous activities. It also takes away any excuse for not getting a part-time job!

Driving has its hazards. Livings as the Kobe's do in the New York north country, this includes considerable time driving on snow-covered roads. I would venture to bet Nik and Tatiana are already better drivers in icy conditions than 99% of Marylanders. Regardless of our age, we all need prayers for safety when we head out onto the roads.

This June, Nikita and Tatiana will be traveling with their parents, Gina Jadwisiak and David Kobe, to visit the orphanages in Novokuznetsk, Russia, where they lived before they were adopted. I am sure this will be a memorable trip. We all have questions about where we came from and I hope this trip will provide some answers. I am thankful that the Kobe's are providing an opportunity for CCPC folks to provide educational toys for the children who are cared for in these orphanages. December, the Russian government has prohibited Americans from adopting children from that country. Until those changes, we can only pray for the many children who won't have the chance to grow with the advantages Americans take for granted.

Twelve years ago, I took my family on a similar trip to Guatemala, the nation of birth for my daughter, Lydia. It was a great trip. We stayed in Antigua, a delightful small town in the beautiful volcanic region. We had a great time. One day, in what is permanently etched in family lore, we rented a car to drive to the city where Lydia was born. We were not three blocks into our drive through this very poor city when Lydia said, "OK, I've seen enough, I am grateful for being adopted and getting to grow up in America." We turned around and went to visit more appealing sites.

There are five passages in the New Testament in which the setting up of a new relationship to God through Jesus Christ is called adoption. Each of us who believe that Jesus is the son of God can be freed from sin and fear by being adopted as a child of God. Since only Jesus is a Son of God by natural right, all the rest of us receive the benefits of our relationship to God by adoption. Like adoptive parents, God chooses us and gives us the opportunity to inherit the full riches of his grace. As Christians, we are all adopted.

We are so blessed. Let us all join in celebrating the achievements of our children and youth.

Healthy Maryland Initiative

At its May meeting, the Session endorsed the "Healthy Maryland Initiative," which is a proposal to raise the tax on cigarettes by \$1 per pack and will reduce Maryland's smoking rate while funding the state tobacco control program and other public health programs in the state. Similar legislation in the past has resulted in Maryland's smoking rate declining 32% over the last dozen years, more than twice the national average. Financial Notes from Session

The offerings for 2013 continue to be below the Faith Expressions. For 2013, the Faith Expressions total \$480,000 for the year, or \$40,000 per month. However, the 2013 Faith Receipts (through April 30, 2013) total \$146,838 for the year or \$36,710 per month. Bottom line is that the Year to Date Offering Budget is under funded by (\$13,162).

The Session realizes that many of you need an automated way to make your monthly giving. We are currently reviewing an option for you to easily make your Faith Expressions automatically to the church, from your bank account directly to the church's account. This will allow you to avoid playing catch-up when you receive your statements during the year. You can continue to place your envelopes in the plate, marked "automatic payment". You will be able to pick the days in the month you wish the withdrawal to be made, up to twice a month. If you don't want to change your current giving method you can continue with your current practice. We just want to give this option to those who have been requesting this choice.

In Memory of Bruce A. Bell

Bruce, who was a former member of CCPC, passed away at Holy Cross Hospital in Fort Lauderdale, Florida on May 16, 2013 at the age of 71 after a valiant struggle with the after effects of a stroke.

Bruce was born in Detroit but spent most of his childhood in Lorneville, New Brunswick, followed by a working career in Toronto and Washington D.C.

Bruce, always a risk taker, had no qualms about leaving a comfortable life in Toronto to live in D.C. This willingness to take on risk continued later in life when at the age of 68 he left Washington for a new life in Fort Lauderdale.

Bruce was a talented carpenter who could build anything from scratch. In his lifetime, he completed several apartment and home renovations almost entirely on his own. As a young man, Bruce loved to drive in car rallies. Later on, as the proud owner of his 60's Lincoln and Cadillac, he was active in antique car clubs in Washington and Florida and was noted for his hosting of numerous car club Christmas parties in Washington.

Bruce had a strong interest in politics from a left of centre perspective and always enjoyed a heated discussion. Always on the lookout for a fun time, he never turned down an invitation to a good party.

Burial will take place in New Brunswick later this Spring with a memorial celebration to follow in Washington D.C. at a later date. 
