## THIS WEEK'S SERMON

Sunday, February 16, 2014

Sermon: "Making Room"

Scripture: Mark 2:1-12

**Synopsis:** In this familiar passage, my attention almost always gravitates to the paralytic and his four friends. Thank God, for them. We all need friends with tenacity like them to help us in our times of need. Their tenacity is a lesson about the power of intercessory action. Sometimes the only way we come to Jesus is by the strength of others. I notice Jesus, too. I take note that the gospel story is about Jesus. Jesus heals. Jesus cares. Jesus has tremendous compassion. But this time around I'm drawn to the crowd—all those who tightly surround Jesus. Who are these people? I've long assumed that these folk were a mass of other needy folk. But verse 6 suggests otherwise. Mark says that those who surrounded Jesus were scribes—scholars, people who'd grown up in the synagogue, knew the Scriptures, had spent years feasting on the benefits of God's graces. They were among the crowd that took the front pews and obstructed a needy man's access to Jesus. This week I wonder about all the ways that we faithful followers obstruct access to Jesus.

## GOOD SAMARITANS RECORD YEAR IN 2013

This is an exciting time in the life of Good Samaritans of Garland. 7,301 families (an increase of 112% over 2013) were served, making it our busiest year ever. Over 439,813 pounds of food were distributed with an estimated value of \$740,506. Total utility assistance of \$78,622 to 436 families was provided through grants from Garland Power & Light and TXU to residents of Garland. With the reductions in the Federal Food Stamp program (SNAP), the anticipated needs of our clients will grow dramatically in 2014.
