In chapter 3 of 1st Timothy, Paul gives the roles and responsibilities of church leaders. Church leadership is vitally important because everything will either rise or fall based on spiritual leadership of the church. **Spiritual leadership** is defined as the God given ability to move people onto God's agenda. The Holy Spirit imparts gifts to every believer for ministry in the church, and among these gifts are: Pastors and teachers (Ephesians 4:11), helps, and governments (1st Cor. 12:28).

Although the church is an organism, the church must have organization or it will die.
