The Reality Of Change

Recently we made a much needed improvement to our campus, by having new signs installed. The first sign to be installed was an attractive and easy to read sign on the Vedette Avenue side of our property. Amazingly, this was the first permanent sign ever placed in that location, despite the fact that Vedette Avenue is a heavily traveled city road and a popular cut through between Main Street and Rosser Avenue. We have plans to place solar powered lights on this sign, so that it will be visible in the dark as well. Our second sign, which was just completed this past week, matches the first one, but is in a lighted sign cabinet. I believe that both of these signs are an attractive upgrade to the exterior of our building, but most importantly, they draw more attention to our church and allow our campus to be found more easily. I thank God for the provision to make this project a reality and for our leaders that had the wisdom to recognize the importance of this project.

As you can tell, I am proud of our new signage, as it becomes another tool for us, as a church, to shine the light of Jesus in our community and grow the Kingdom of God, sharing the Gospel message of Jesus Christ. However, you might wonder why I am using this article to talk about signs. While the overwhelming response from those who call WWCC home and even some who don't has been very positive concerning the new signs, recently upon completion of the new lighted front sign, a comment was made by someone that they "are not a fan of change," and that they liked the old sign better. This person believed that this sign, which was probably around 40 years old, falling a part and hard to read even when it was brand new, could have been rebuilt. And then, knowing that the old sign was gone forever, never to return, this same person made the comment, "I hope the flower garden was kept."

I do not share this to shame or to embarrass anyone, which is why these comments are shared anonymously, but I share these comments for a very important reason. While every effort was made to save the bushes that are planted around this sign, the fact is, that if our concern is for flowers and an old sign, that had far outlived its usefulness, then our church is in BIG trouble! I understand that as human beings we don't like change, but whether we like it or not, CHANGE HAPPENS. Everything around us has always been in a constant state of change and in today's culture, technology has only accelerated that change, and if we as the Church do not make changes, the Church will be left behind and tragically labeled as "out of touch," "irrelevant," or worse. A failure to change will result in WWCC succumbing to the challenging reality for churches today, in which those who would rather stay the same, continue to decline and eventually lock their doors for the last time.

While God's Word never changes; methods, music and even signs must change, if we desire WWCC to survive and thrive into the future, together pointing people to Jesus and building the Kingdom of God. Don't forget the Church's Biblical purpose! As I said in a recent sermon, the church is not a club you join, but rather the hope of the world. Nothing good will result from fighting, blocking or even complaining about change, because if we choose to respond to change in any of those ways, either we will stay the same and die or changes will be made, but they won't matter, because the unchurched won't want to hear about Jesus from people that choose to complain about those changes. I hope and pray that you will choose to have a bigger and more selfless perspective that focuses on the unchanging Jesus, rather than the changes that are implemented to better proclaim His Name.

On a very encouraging note: A BIG thank you to everyone who made a real difference in our community recently by giving up an hour of their time to ring a bell, in support of the Salvation Army's Red Kettle Campaign. During the time that WWCC volunteers rang the bell, \$439.41 was collected and in part, because of you, for the very first time, the Salvation Army of Waynesboro operated its Red Kettle Campaign completely on volunteers!

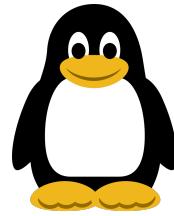

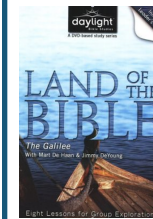
