"PROGRESS"

At our most recent and final QUARTERLY congregational meeting, the final step of approving revised bylaws, in moving to an annual congregational meeting and budget was completed. As has been made known throughout this process, the reason for this relates to establishing a more functional, efficient and accountable financial process. The old quarterly budget process, at times made budgeting for certain events more difficult and harder to accurately report those expenses, because many of the church's yearly expenses don't always fit neatly within one quarter, due to the timing of how bills are invoiced and paid. Going to an annual budgeting system, will also allow us to have an annual, independent audit performed, because under the rather antiquated quarterly budget system, we were hard pressed to find an accounting firm that would work with us.

At this same final QUARTERLY congregational meeting, I also reminded those in attendance that we live in very challenging and rapidly changing times and that no where are those challenges felt more, than in the Church. These challenging times make ministry and the accomplishing of Jesus' Great Commission in the twenty-first century difficult and complicated. Kingdom success requires that we continue to move forward and make progress, as we adapt to an ever changing world, because while the Word of God (The Bible) never changes, everything else is always changing. Having this kind of mindset and strategy involves making progress and implementing changes, and just one of the areas, amidst a variety of areas, that we must continue to make progress in, as together we grow the Kingdom of God, is by increasing our community "footprint." By community "footprint" I mean that we must continue to find ways to get the name of our church out into the community, as we build our reputation as a church that cares about and is involved in the well-being of our community.

Over the past several years, one way that we have chosen to do this has been through the sponsoring of a Waynesboro Generals baseball game. It was a time many of us looked forward to and a fantastic opportunity to get out and bless and build relationships with people in our community. This year, due to the increased financial commitment of sponsoring a game, we will not be able to do it, however, we are trying a new community outreach event. In order for this outreach event to be successful, we need your help.

Because so much of making progress in the Church, all to the Glory of God, is developing and maintaining the proper perspective and attitude and since we all sometimes need a reminder that the work of the Church is not primarily about us, but rather about those that we should be seeking to reach, who are outside of a relationship with God, I concluded our final QUARTERLY congregational meeting by sharing an excerpt of an article that appeared in the April 2018 Christian Standard. I share that excerpt with you below:

"Here's the thing: The church is not a "bless me" club meant to provide comfortable seats and feel-good messages for its members. Christian fellowship and community are absolutely important. But what's more important is the church's role to equip its members with the knowledge of the Word of God - so that we will boldly engage in the war that is taking place over the souls of mankind."

Make no mistake about it, the Church is in a war and many churches have already fallen victim in the battle. The Church will win the war, Jesus promises us victory, but not every church will survive the battle we find ourselves in! It's my prayer, that our church (WWCC) will not become a casualty of the war. May we continue to make progress, so that WWCC will not only survive, but also thrive!


Background Check Policy


