




Greetings from the Trinity Youth Group!

“For the Lord is Righteous, he loves justice; the upright will see his face.” Psalm 11:7

Winter Ski Retreat 2020

The plans for the Winter Retreat are being put into place. Here are the details that you need to know now. We will leave Trinity (school side) at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday, December 27. We will return on Tuesday, December 29 at approximately 12:00 noon. Cost for the trip is \$250.

Our accommodations will be at the Kalahari Resort in the Wisconsin Dells. You will have access to the waterpark when we arrive. Our house will not be available till approximately 4:00 p.m. You need to have a separate bag with anything you need at the waterpark. Towels are provided by the resort.
