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## FROM NON-ESSENTIAL TO THE STATE OF BEING ESSENTIAL

When Governor Gavin Newsom's Administration of California declared the local church in every city, county and state as "**non-essential**" to the well-being of his constituency I must admit something arose up in me that I would term "*righteous indignation*" to say the least. These past few weeks have been most painful to see the church being placed on what one may call the back burner of the stove.

I was not surprised by his attitude for when he expressed his contempt for us Christians when as mayor of San Francisco, he objected to the voters of California who voted to keep marriage defined as that between one man and one woman. If you remember in 2000, the State of California adopted Proposition 22 which, as an ordinary statute, forbade recognition or licensing of same-sex marriages in the state. During February and March 2004, San Francisco Mayor Gavin Newsom directed the licensing of same-sex marriages on the basis of the state's equal protection clause.

Also at the time Republican California Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger stated that although he opposed and twice vetoed legislative bills that would recognize same-sex marriage in California, he respected and would uphold the court's ruling and oppose the initiative and other attempts to amend the state's constitution.

If you remember, Proposition 8 was created by opponents of same-sex marriage prior to the final ruling on in regards to marriage cases as a voter ballot initiative, and voted on at the time of the November 2008 elections. Some of you may remember that we as a church took an active role in support of measure and it was passed by the voters of California. Its wording was precisely the same as Proposition 22, which is an ordinary statute.

Then the Politicians really got involved...such people as California's U.S. senators, Dianne Feinstein and Barbara Boxer, voiced their opposition to Proposition 8. Also voicing their opposition were the Lieutenant Governor, State Controller John Chiang, former governor and Attorney General Jerry Brown, 42 of 80 members of the state assembly, half of the state senators, and the **mayors of San Francisco, Los Angeles, and San Diego: Gavin Newsom**, Antonio Villaraigosa, and Jerry Sanders, respectively The pro- and anti-Prop 8 campaigns spent a combined \$106 million on the campaign. The only thing that surpasses that was a Proposition for Native Americans, dealing with the expansion of Native American gambling. This State of California has been going downhill in morality ever since.

You see these people don't care about us as a church in regards to what we describe as morality or godliness. Just as they have redefined marriage they have redefined morality. They have one quest in mind. Power!!! They will use anything they can in order to maintain their public role to quash most anything that the church stands for....even to the point of taking control of the media outlets and public means by which we may get the message out as to how we feel about such measures of ungodliness. The writer of Proverbs declares: *Righteousness exalteth a nation: but sin is a reproach to any people.* (Pro 14:34)

Our Governor and State Representatives in Sacramento are not the only ones. We see it happening in Michigan, my home state, Illinois, even in New York. I could not believe my ears when Governor Andrew Cuomo who, in mid-April was celebrating things happening in New York going better than expected. He was insistent that God didn't make things better, man's hard work did. He said: *"The number is down because we brought the number down."* And then he emphasized: *"God did not do that. Faith did not do that. Destiny did not do that. A lot of pain and suffering did that...That's how it works."* Oh really Governor of New York....is this what you think? Have you got a lesson coming very soon. The scripture says, *"A man's pride will bring him low, but the humble in spirit will retain honor." Prov. 29:23* How many politicians have we seen in the past which even the people of the land brought down low?

## I HAVE FAITH IN THE CHURCH

**Folks our elected officials closed the doors of our church**. How can we be silent? How can we not protest? How can we sit in silence and call ourselves Christian witnesses.
