GOD PURSUES A LOVE RELATIONSHIP

Carrie's Cancer

When one of my children could not get his own way, he would occasionally say, "You don't love me." Was that true? No, my love had not changed. At that moment, however, my love was expressing itself differently than he wanted it to.

When our only daughter, Carrie, was 16, the doctors told us she had cancer. Doctors had noticed a small spot on an X-ray but had not followed up on it for two years. Now the cancer was advanced. We had to take her through extensive chemotherapy and radiation. We suffered along with Carrie as we watched her experience the severe sickness that accompanies the treatments. Some people face such an experience by blaming God and questioning why He doesn't love them anymore. Carrie's cancer treatments could have been a devastating experience for us. Did God still love us? Yes. Had His love changed? No, He still cared for us with an infinite love.

When you face circumstances like this, you can ask God to explain what is happening. We did that. We asked Him what we should do. I raised all of those questions, but I never said, "Lord, I guess You don't love me."

Long before this experience with Carrie, I determined that no matter what my circumstances, I would never look at my situation except against the backdrop of the cross. In the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, God forever convinced me that He loved me. For this reason, during Carrie's illness I could go before the heavenly Father and see behind my daughter the cross of Jesus Christ. I said, "Father, don't ever let me look at my life and question Your love for me. Your love for me was settled on the cross. That has never changed and will never change." Our love relationship with the heavenly Father sustained us through an extremely difficult time.

No matter what your circumstances are, God's love never changes. The cross, the death of Jesus Christ, and His resurrection are God's final, total, and complete expression of His love for you. Never allow your heart to question God's love. Settle it on the front end of your desire to know Him and experience Him. He loves you. He created you for a love relationship. He has been pursuing you in that love relationship. Every encounter He has with you is an expression of His love for you. God would cease to be God if He expressed Himself in any way other than perfect love!

A love relationship with God is more important than any other single factor in your life.

CREATED FOR A LOVE RELATIONSHIP

In the first two units I introduced you to some basic truths for knowing and doing the will of God. The seven realities you have examined summarize the kind of relationship through which God works to accomplish His purposes. As I said earlier, this course was not written to teach you a program, a method, or a formula for knowing and doing God's will. It was written to point you to a relationship with God. God will then work through that relationship to accomplish through you whatever He pleases.

WITH ALL YOUR HEART


In this unit I want to help you see that God Himself pursues a love relationship with you. He takes the initiative to bring you into this relationship. He created you for fellowship with Himself. That is the purpose of your life. This love relationship can and should be real and personal to you.

If you were standing before God, could you describe your relationship with Him by saying, "I love You with all my heart and all my soul and If not, how would you describe your current relationship with God?

One of our church members was always having difficulty in his personal life, with his family, at work, and in the church. In a church meeting he became extremely angry and stormed out of the room. It was obvious his life was filled with anger. Soon after, I met with him and asked, "Can you describe your relationship with God by sincerely saying, 'I love You with all my heart'?"

The strangest look came over his face. He said, "Nobody has ever asked me that. No, I could not describe my relationship with God that way. I could say I obey Him, I serve Him, I worship Him, and I fear Him. But I cannot say I love Him." This man had a father who never told him he loved him. The son feared his father, but he didn't love him. The man had wrongly assumed God was the same kind of Father. I helped this man realize God loved him and wanted to have loving fellowship with him. That truth set the man free to experience the love of His heavenly Father.

Everything in this man's life was out of order because God's basic purpose for his life was missing. God created us for a love relationship with Him. If you cannot describe your relationship with God by saying that you love Him with all your being, you need to ask the Holy Spirit to bring you into that kind of a relationship.

If I tried to summarize the entire Old Testament, it would be expressed in this verse: "Listen, Israel: The LORD our God, the LORD is one. Love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your strength" (Deut. 6:4-5).

Throughout the Old Testament, God expressed His love for people. The essence of the New Testament is the same. Quoting from Deuteronomy, Jesus said the greatest commandment in the law is "Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mark 12:30). Everything in your Christian life, everything about knowing Him and experiencing Him, everything about knowing His will depends on the quality of your love relationship with God. If that is not settled, nothing in your life will be right.

A LOVE RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

DAY 2

Picture in your mind a tall ladder leaning against a wall. Now think about your life as a process of climbing that ladder. Wouldn't it be a tragedy to ascend to the top and find you had placed the ladder against the wrong wall? One life to live, and you missed it! Earlier in the course we talked about your life being God-centered. That means your life must be properly related to God. This is the love relationship for which you were created—a God-centered love relationship. Your walk with God (Father, Son, and Spirit) is the single most important aspect of your life. If it is not as it should be, nothing else will function properly.

I have known businesspeople who lost their business, their money, and their property. With everything stripped away, they had to decide if having Jesus was enough for them to still have joy. If you lost all of your money and possessions, but you had a vibrant walk with God, could you truly be happy? We are a doing people. We feel worthless or useless if we are not busy doing something. Scripture leads us to understand that God is saying, "I want you to love Me above everything else. When you are in a relationship of love with Me, you have everything you need." To be loved by God is the highest relationship, the greatest achievement, and the noblest position in life.

That does not mean you will never accomplish anything as an expression of your love for God. He will call you to obey Him and do whatever He asks of you. However, you do not need to do something to feel fulfilled. You are completely fulfilled in a relationship with God. When you are filled with Him, what else do you need?

Do you really want to love the Lord your God with all your heart? He will allow no competitors, not money and possessions, not fame and popularity, and not power or authority. God says:

"No one can serve two masters, since either he will hate one and love the other, or he will be devoted to one and despise the other. You cannot serve both God and money" (Matt. 6:24).

• "When the Lord your God brings you into the land he swore to your ancestors Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob that he would give you—a land with large and beautiful cities that you did not build, houses full of every good thing that you did not fill them with, cisterns that you did not dig, and vineyards and olive groves that you did not plant—and when you eat and are satisfied, be careful not to forget the Lord who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the place of slavery. Fear the Lord your God, worship him, and take your oaths in his name. Do not follow other gods, the gods of the peoples around you, for the Lord your God, who is among you, is a jealous God" (Deut. 6:10-15).

CREATED FOR ETERNITY

God did not create you for time; He created you for eternity. Time—your lifetime on earth—provides the opportunity for you to become acquainted with Him. It provides occasions for Him to develop your character into His likeness. Then eternity will hold its fullest dimensions for you.

If you live only for time—the here and now—you will miss the ultimate purpose of creation. If you live for time, you will allow your past to determine your life today. Your life as a child of God ought to be driven by the future—what you will be one day. God uses your present experiences to mold you for future usefulness here on earth and in eternity.

I was speaking at a conference when a woman approached me and recounted the heartbreaking story of how her father had abandoned her and her family. She described her feelings of worthlessness, abandonment, and rejection. For years she was consumed with finding her father and convincing him she was not worthless and he should take her back. "Then one day I found my Father," she said. "He was at the back of the Experiencing God book." She had been studying Experiencing God and had come to the list of the names of God. She realized her heavenly Father had always loved her and had been seeking a love relationship with her. Her heavenly Father set her free from the bondage to which her earthly father had consigned her.

Paul had to overcome his difficult personal history. Here was his approach to dealing with his past and present:

⁴If anyone else thinks he has grounds for confidence in the flesh, I have more: ⁵ circumcised the eighth day; of the nation of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew born of Hebrews; regarding the law, a Pharisee; ⁶ regarding zeal, persecuting the church; regarding the righteousness that is in the law, blameless.

⁷But everything that was a gain to me, I have considered to be a loss because of Christ. ⁸More than that, I also consider everything to be a loss in view of the surpassing value of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. Because of him I have suffered the loss of all things and consider them as dung, so that I may gain Christ ⁹and be found in him, not having a righteousness of my own from the law, but one that is through faith in Christ—the righteousness from God based on faith. ¹⁰My goal is to know him and the power of his resurrection and the fellowship of his sufferings, being conformed to his death, ¹¹assuming that I will somehow reach the resurrection from among the dead.

¹²Not that I have already reached the goal or am already perfect, but I make every effort to take hold of it because I also have been taken hold of by Christ Jesus. ¹³Brothers and sisters, I do not consider myself to have taken hold of it. But one thing I do: Forgetting what is behind and reaching forward to what is ahead, ¹⁴I pursue as my goal the prize promised by God's heavenly call in Christ Jesus (Phil. 3:4–14).

Answers: (a) Paul was faithful to his heritage as a Jew from the tribe of Benjamin. He was faultless in keeping the laws of the Pharisees. He was zealous for God. (b) He considered them rubbish and loss. (c) Paul wanted to know Christ, to be found in Him, and to become like Him to attain a future blessing (resurrection from the dead). (d) He refused to focus on the past. He strained toward the future. He pressed toward the future goal of a heavenly prize.

Paul's desire was to know Christ and to become like Him. You too can order your life under God's direction so you come to know Him, love Him, and become like Christ. Let your present be molded and shaped by what you are becoming

in Christ. You were created for eternity!

INVESTING IN THE FUTURE

Begin orienting your life to God's will. His purposes go far beyond time and into eternity. Make sure you are investing your life, time, and resources in things that will last, not in things that will pass away. If you don't recognize that God created you for eternity, you will invest in the wrong priorities. You should store up treasures in heaven (see Matt. 6:19-21,33).

This is why a love relationship with God is so important. He loves you. He knows what is best for you. Only He can guide you to invest your life in worthwhile ways. This guidance will come as you walk with Him and listen to Him.

WALKING WITH GOD

Day 3

God created the first man and woman, Adam and Eve, for a love relationship with Himself. After Adam and Eve sinned, they heard God walking in the garden in the cool of the day. They hid from Him because of their fear and shame. Try to sense the heart of a loving Father when He asked that tenderhearted question "Where are you?" (Gen. 3:9). God knew something had happened to their love relationship.

When your relationship is as it ought to be, you will always be in fellowship with the Father. You will remain in His presence, enjoying your love relationship with the God of the universe. When Adam and Eve were missing, something had gone terribly wrong. When your relationship is as it ought to be, you will always be in fellowship with the Father.

QUIET TIME WITH GOD

Early each day I have an appointment with God. I often wonder what happens when the God who loves me comes to meet with me and I have missed our appointment. How does He feel when He asks, "Henry, where are you?" and I am not there (see Jer. 7:13). This applies to my daily time with God. I keep that time alone with God, not in order to have a relationship, but because I have a relationship. Because I have a close walk with my Lord, I want to meet with Him and spend time with Him. Time with God enriches and deepens the relationship I already have with Him.

I hear many people say, "I really struggle trying to have time alone with God." If that is a problem you face, let me suggest something: make the priority in your life to love Him with all your heart. That will solve most of your problem with your quiet time. People who struggle to spend time with God don't have a scheduling problem; they have a love problem. You have a quiet time because you know Him and therefore love Him, not just because you want to learn more about Him. The apostle Paul said Christ's love compelled or constrained him (see 2 Cor. 5:14).

When two persons love each other and plan to marry, they want to find out information about each other. However, that is not the primary reason they date. They spend time together because they love each other and enjoy being together.

Similarly, you will learn much about God, His Word, His purposes, and His ways as you spend time with Him. You will come to know Him as you experience Him working in and through your life. But learning about Him is not why you should want to have a quiet time with Him. The more you know Him and experience His unfathomable love, the more you will love Him. The more you love Him, the more you will enjoy spending time fellowshipping with Him.

2 Corinthians 5:14

"For the love of Christ compels us, since we have reached this conclusion, that one died for all, and therefore all died."

Today's lesson is shorter than normal to allow time for the following assignment. You may be able to do it today, but you might choose to set aside time later in the week. Plan to complete the assignment prior to your next small group session. This assignment may require some planning or adjustments. Feel free to modify the assignment to your personal needs and circumstances.

Just as Adam and Eve walked with God in the cool of the day, set aside at least 30 minutes for a time to walk with God. If your location, physical condition, and weather permit, find a place outside to walk. Use this time to get out of your routine. You may even want to plan a special trip for part of a day to be alone with God. The place could be: in your neighborhood, a wooded area in the country, a city park, a beach, a garden, a mountain road, a lakeshore, or somewhere private.

Spend time walking and talking with God. If the location permits, you may even want to talk out loud. Focus your thoughts on your heavenly Father's love for you and your love for Him. Praise Him for His love and mercy. Thank Him for expressions of His love to you. Be specific. Express your love for Him through worship.

GOD PURSUES A LOVE RELATIONSHIP

DAY 4

God always takes the initiative in our love relationship. The witness of the entire Bible testifies that God pursues us and orchestrates ways for us to experience Him. He came to Adam and Eve in the garden. In love He had fellowship with them and they with Him. He came to Noah, Abraham, Moses, and the prophets. God took the initiative for people in the Old Testament to experience Him in a personal fellowship of love. In the New Testament, Jesus approached His disciples and chose them to be with Him and to experience His love. He came to Paul on the Damascus road.

In our natural human state we do not seek God on our own initiative.

Read Romans 3:10-12 in the margin and answer these questions a. How many people are naturally righteous?

No one! Not even one! Sin has marred us so deeply that we don't seek God on our own initiative. Therefore, if we are to have a relationship with Him and His Son, God must take the initiative. This is exactly what He does.

God reaches out to you with an everlasting love. Based on that love He pursues you. He has drawn you with cords of love when you were not His friend but His enemy. He gave His Son to die for you. If you are going to experience God and know His will, you must be absolutely convinced of God's love for you.

God takes the initiative. He chooses us, loves us, and reveals His eternal purposes for our lives.

"When Jesus came to the region of Caesarea Philippi, he asked his disciples, 'Who do people say the Son of Man is?"

"They replied, 'Some say John the Baptist; others say Elijah; and still others, Jeremiah or one of the prophets.'

"'But what about you?' he asked. 'Who do you say I am?'

"Simon Peter answered, 'You are the Christ, the Son of the living God."

"Jesus replied, 'Blessed are you, Simon son of Jonah, for this was not revealed to you by man, but by my Father in heaven.' "

How do you know God loves you? What evidence in your life convinces you that God loves you?

God came to Saul, later known as Paul (see Acts 9:1-19). Saul was opposing God and His people and was fighting against God's Son. Jesus came to Saul and revealed the Father's purposes of love for him. This is also true in our lives. We do not choose Him. He chooses us, loves us, and reveals His eternal purposes for us (see Rom. 8:29-30).

Jesus said to His disciples, "You did not choose me, but I chose you. I appointed you. However, because you are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of it, the world hates you" (John 15:16,19). Didn't Peter choose to follow Jesus? No. Jesus chose Peter. Peter responded to God's invitation. God took the initiative.

Peter was responding to God's initiative in his life (see Matt. 16:13-17). Jesus asked the disciples who people said He was. Then He asked them who they thought He was. Peter correctly answered, "You are the Messiah." Then Jesus made a profound statement: "Flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but my Father in heaven."

How did Peter learn that Jesus was the Christ, the promised Messiah?

In essence Jesus said, "Peter, you could never have known and confessed that I am the Christ unless My Father had been at work in your life. He caused you to know who I am. You are responding to the Father's activity in your life."

How do you know God loves you? What evidence in your life convinces you that God loves you?

God came to Saul, later known as Paul (see Acts 9:1-19). Saul was opposing God and His people and was fighting against God's Son. Jesus came to Saul and revealed the Father's purposes of love for him. This is also true in our lives. We do not choose Him. He chooses us, loves us, and reveals His eternal purposes for us (see Rom. 8:29-30).

Jesus said to His disciples, "You did not choose me, but I chose you. I appointed you. However, because you are not of the world, but I have chosen you out of it, the world hates you" (John 15:16,19). Didn't Peter choose to follow Jesus? No. Jesus chose Peter. Peter responded to God's invitation. God took the initiative.

Peter was responding to God's initiative in his life (see Matt. 16:13-17). Jesus asked the disciples who people said He was. Then He asked them who they thought He was. Peter correctly answered, "You are the Messiah." Then Jesus made a profound statement: "Flesh and blood did not reveal this to you, but my Father in heaven."

How did Peter learn that Jesus was the Christ, the promised Messiah?

In essence Jesus said, "Peter, you could never have known and confessed that I am the Christ unless My Father had been at work in your life. He caused you to know who I am. You are responding to the Father's activity in your life."

DAY 5

A REAL, PERSONAL, PRACTICAL RELATIONSHIP

God's plan for the advancement of His kingdom depends on His relationship with His people. The relationship God wants to have with you will be real and personal. By "real" I mean that God is more than a doctrine or a person in history. He wants to interact with you on a personal level today. He is also practical in how He relates to you. Some people ask, Can a person actually have a real, personal, and practical relationship with God? They seem to think God is far off and unconcerned about their day-to-day living. That is not the God we see in the Scriptures.

From Genesis to Revelation we see God relating to people in real, personal, intimate, and practical ways. God had wonderful fellowship with **Adam and Eve**, walking in the garden with them in the cool of the day. When they sinned, God pursued them to restore the love relationship. He met a practical need by providing clothing to cover their nakedness.

Hagar fled for her life after Sarai used and mistreated her. When she reached the end of her resources, had nowhere else to turn, when all hope was gone, and everyone had forsaken her, God came to Hagar. In her relationship with God, she learned that God saw her, knew her needs, and would lovingly provide for her. God is extremely personal.

Hannah experienced years of disappointment and hurt. She poured out her sorrow in worship and God met her need in a very practical and powerful way, giving her a son, Samuel, the following year.

The disciples also had a real, personal, and practical relationship with Jesus. Jesus chose them to be with Him. What a joy it must have been to walk with Jesus daily as the twelve disciples did! When Jesus gave them a difficult assignment, He did not send them out without any help. He gave them instruction and authority they had never known before, even over evil spirits.

In some places of the world, obedience to the Lord results in imprisonment. This was Peter's experience. In answer to prayer, the Lord miraculously delivered him. This was so dramatic Peter first thought it was a dream. The Christians who were praying for Peter thought he was an angel when he appeared at the door. Soon they discovered the Lord's deliverance was real. That deliverance probably saved Peter's life.

In exile on the island of Patmos, John was spending the Lord's Day in fellowship with God. During this time of communion in the Spirit, the revelation of Jesus Christ came to John to "show his servants what must soon take place" (Rev. 1:1). This message has encouraged churches from John's day until now.

Do you sense, as you read Scripture, God expressed Himself to people in personal and practical ways? Do you see their relationships with God were practical? Was He also real and personal to Noah? to Abraham? to Moses? to Isaiah? Yes! Has God changed? No! What was true in the Old Testament also occurred during the time of Jesus' life and ministry. It was the same after the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost. Your life can also reflect a real, personal, and practical relationship as you respond to God's work in your life.

Briefly describe an experience in your life when God was real, personal, and practical in His relationship with you.

Love must be personal and practical. A person cannot love without someone to love. A love relationship with God takes place between two persons. A relationship with God is not merely a belief system, it is personal. This has always been His desire. His efforts are expended to bring this desire to reality. God is a Person pouring His life into yours. Christianity is a personal, practical, progressive relationship with almighty God.

If for some reason you cannot think of a time when your relationship with God was real, personal, and practical, spend time evaluating your current relationship with Him. Go to the Lord in prayer and ask Him to reveal the true nature of your walk with Him. Ask Him to bring you into the kind of relationship He desires for you. If you realize you have never entered a saving relationship with God, turn to the activity on page 8 for help in settling that most important issue now.

GOD'S PRESENCE AND WORK IN YOUR LIFE ARE PRACTICAL

Some people say to me, "Henry, what you are suggesting about doing God's will is not practical in our day." I always differ with them. God is an extremely practical God. He was in Scripture. He is the same today. When He provided manna, quail, and water for the children of Israel, He was being extremely practical. When Jesus fed five thousand people, He was being practical. The God I see revealed in Scripture is real, personal, and practical. You can trust God to be exceedingly practical as He relates to you too.

God's constant presence is the most practical aspect of your life and ministry. Unfortunately, we often assign God a limited role in our lives. We only call on Him when we need help. That is the exact opposite of what we find in God's Word. He is the One who is working in our world. He invites you to relate to Him so He accomplishes His work through you. His plan for the advancement of His kingdom depends on His working in real and practical ways through His people.

Knowing and experiencing God through a real and personal relationship was practical in the Scriptures. I believe you will find that this kind of walk with God will be profoundly helpful to you as well. God can make an enormous difference in your relationships in your family, in your church, and with other people.
