This course will consider the biblical mandate for the church to be missionaries to the community and serve the spiritual, social, and physical needs of the people there-in. It will help students to better understand the spiritual nature of the church, thus creating an incentive to reach out as servants to the community.
AM	WS-01: Maximizing Your Curriculum for VBS/Sunday School/Discipleship	Rev. Dr. George T. Brooks, Jr.	This course will familiarize the students with SSPB resources such as needs assessments, curriculum, literature, and strategies of the local church for implementation.

Dr. William Terry Ladd, III	This course will introduce the believer to the biblical principle of discipleship; examine the character traits of believers, while looking at the overall examples of Jesus. Students will study discipleship methods of Jesus and the difference between discipleship and membership.
